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

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



The Fairy Queen is persuaded to pardon Iolanthe and so the fairies learn of her son Strephon, who tells his newfound aunts of his sorry situation. Strephon, a bartender at the Arcadia club, fancies the apron off of waitress Phyllis - but then again who doesn't? The peers certainly do! The only problem? His boss, the Lord Chancellor has a mind to take Phyllis for himself. Rodgers & Hammerstein's Cinderella

The timeless enchantment of a magical fairy tale is reborn with the Rodgers & Hammerstein hallmarks of originality, charm and elegance. Originally presented on television in 1957 starring Julie Andrews, Rodgers & Hammerstein's *Cinderella* was the most widely viewed program in the history of the medium. Its recreation in 1965 starring Lesley Ann Warren was no less successful in transporting a new generation to the miraculous kingdom of dreams-come-true, and so was a second remake in 1997, which starred Brandy as Cinderella, Whoopi Goldberg as Queen Constantina and Whitney Houston as her Fairy Godmother.

As adapted for the stage, with great warmth and more than a touch of hilarity, our WAGS production of *Cinderella - The "Enchanted Edition"* - is based on the 1997 teleplay. The hearts of children and adults alike still soar when the slipper fits!

The 1957 film starring Julie Andrews

In the 1950s, television adaptations of musicals were fairly common. Broadcast versions of *Annie Get Your Gun*, *Wonderful Town*, *Anything Goes* and *Kiss Me, Kate* were all seen during the decade. In 1955, NBC had broadcast the Broadway musical *Peter Pan*, starring Mary Martin. It was a hit, and the network looked for more family-oriented musical projects. Richard Rodgers had previously supplied the Emmy Award-winning score for *Victory at Sea*, a documentary series about World War II. NBC approached Rodgers and Hammerstein and asked them to write an original musical, expressly for television, then a novel idea. The team decided to adapt the fairy tale *Cinderella* and, new to television, they sought the advice of an industry insider, Richard Lewine. Lewine was then the Vice President in charge of colour television at CBS. He told Rodgers and Hammerstein that CBS was also seeking a musical project and had already signed Julie Andrews, who was then starring in *My Fair Lady* on Broadway.

In adapting the famous fairy tale, Rodgers and Hammerstein stayed faithful to the original Charles Perrault version. Hammerstein was interviewed by the *Saturday Review* about the adaptation: "We went the kids who see it to recognize the story they knew. Children can be very critical on that score. But, of course, their parents will be watching too, so we have tried to humanize the characters without altering the familiar plot structure." The musical had to fit into the 90-minute program with six commercial breaks, so it was divided into six short acts.

Rehearsals started on February 21, 1957. In early March, the company moved to CBS Television Color Studio 72, the first CBS-TV colour studio in New York and the smallest colour studio in the CBS empire at the time. The 56 performers, 33 musicians and 80 stagehands and crew worked crammed into the small studio, a wardrobe of up to 100 costumes, over half a dozen huge set pieces, and numerous props and special effects equipment. The orchestra played in a small room with special equipment to overcome the suppressed acoustics. CBS invested in a massive marketing campaign, as did the sponsors. Ed Sullivan also promoted the show, which would be seen in his usual Sunday night time slot, with an appearance by Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II on the previous Sunday. It was broadcast live on March 31, 1957.

Synopsis

ACT 1 'Prologue'

The Fairy Godmother sets the scene with a young Cinderella losing both her Mother and Father, but providing an unexpected sense of comfort and strength to her without her knowing. We move to the Village Square where the villagers and tradespeople are busy going about their day, including the Stepmother and Stepsisters, Grate and Joy, who love to shop. Cinderella, now an adult, is seen following them, later with shopping and dreams of a life with kindness and love rather than being treated like a servant by her ill-tempered and selfish stepmother and stepsisters ('*The Sweetest Sounds*'). Little does she know that Prince Christopher, dressed as a village boy, is also in the village and is also dreaming of finding his love and someone to share his life with, without his parents getting involved.

Enter Lionel, the Prince's Steward and friend, announcing that "*The Prince Is Giving a Ball*" - a party set up by the King and Queen without Christopher knowing, to help find a bride. The ladies of the kingdom, including the Stepfamily, are thrilled at the prospect of meeting him. Cinderella carries their shopping parcels for them, and when they return home, all three order Cinderella about. Left alone in her corner near the fire, she dreams of living an exotic life as a princess or anything other than a servant ('*In My Own Little Corner*'). Meanwhile, the King and Queen are busy making arrangements for the Ball but the Queen worries that her son will never find a bride and she will never become a Grandmother. Christopher is annoyed that they are getting involved in his love life and, when he leaves, the King and Queen hope their son will find a love like theirs ('*Boys and Girls Like You and Me*').

As Cinderella's Stepsister and Stepsisters get ready for the Ball, hoping that they will catch the Prince's eye, they laugh at Cinderella's dreams. Finally, they leave, and Cinderella imagines having gone with them. She holds her Mother's old dress in her arms, treasuring it. As she seeks strength at the Pumpkin Patch, Cinderella's Fairy Godmother appears and, persuaded by the fervour of Cinderella's wish to go to the ball, she transforms Cinderella into a beautifully gowned young lady. Her little mouse friends and a pumpkin are transformed into a glittering carriage with footmen ('*Desirable & It's Possible*') and she leaves for the Ball. However, the Fairy Godmother warns her not to stay past midnight.

ACT 2

In the Royal Ballroom the Prince is bored by the attention of all the young ladies including the Stepsisters, with whom he has to dance '*Gavotte*'. Cinderella arrived at the palace at 11:30pm and her grand entrance immediately attracts everyone's attention and intrigues the Prince. They dance together '*The Waltz*' and instantly fall in love ('*Ten Minutes Ago*'). Seeing the Prince with a beauty whom they do not recognise in the Royal Gardens, the stepsisters ask why he wouldn't prefer a "usual" girl like them ('*Stepisters' Lament*'). The Prince declares his love for her ('*Do I Love You Because You're Beautiful?*') As they kiss, the clock begins to strike midnight, and Cinderella flees before the magic wears off, but in her haste she drops a glass slipper.

Upon arriving home from the Palace, Cinderella's Stepmother and Stepsisters reminisce about the Ball and find that Cinderella is very intuitive about what it must have been like going to the Ball ('*When You're Driving Through the Moonlight*') and dancing with the Prince ('*A Lovely Night*'). Meanwhile, the Prince is searching for the woman with whom he danced ('*The Search*') and who fled so quickly from the Ball. At Cinderella's house, the slipper will not fit any of the ladies. The Stepmother tries to steer Lionel from Cinderella, by hiding her in another room. However, Cinderella bravely appears from the shadows to try on the shoe.

Cinderella and the Prince subsequently marry at the palace and, of course, live happily ever after ('*Wedding Finale*').






