ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

The Society thanks all who have contributed in any way towards the successful production of this show.

THE STORY concerns the son of the King of Barataria who was stolen in infancy by the Spanish Inquisition. The baby had been concealed in Venice and brought up as the son of a humble gondolier. On the King's death, the Grand Inquisitor comes to Venice in search of the rightful heir only to find that the gondolier had died without declaring which of his "sons" was the actual prince. The situation is further complicated by the fact that both sons are married and that the Royal Prince was married in infancy to Casilda, the daughter of the Duke of Plaza-Toro - a somewhat disreputable Spanish Grandee. Casilda herself, not knowing of her early marriage is very much in love with a member of her father's suite.

It is arranged that the two gondoliers should reign jointly in Barataria until, a typical Gilbertian twist in the tale in the dying minutes of the opera leaves everyone "on the whole delighted" including, we hope, our audience.

President's Message

After the first performance of The Gondoliers on 7th December 1889, Gilbert wrote to Sullivan:
"I must thank you for the magnificent work you have put into the piece. It gives one the chance of shining right through the twentieth century with a reflected light."

Sullivan replied:
"Don't talk of reflected light. In such a perfect book as The Gondoliers, you shine with an individual brilliancy which no other writer can hope to attain."

We have tried, an hundred years on, to fulfill the prophecy - we hope you enjoy it!
