JEROME KERN was born in New York on 27 January 1885. Looking back over those 00 years one can trace an early association with music through his mother, herself a lifted pianist and his first teacher, the composing of songs for school productions and t 17, a place at the New York College of Music.

Jerome Kern's early years with the professional theatre were spent writing 'interpolated' songs considered necessary to add a native spark to shows that came o America from England and Europe. His meeting with Guy Bolton and P.G. Wodehouse n 1915 brought together three talents that produced a series of shows over the next lecade which were enormously popular in New York — the best known being "Very 3cod Eddie" and "Oh, Boy!". But his greatest acclaim came with Oscar Hammerstein I and "Show Boat".

"Show Boat" opened at the Ziegfeld Theatre, New York on 27 December 1927. t broke with the established pattern of musical shows; the story was credible, the characters colourful and the portrayal of the life of southern Negroes added to the drama. Particularly poignant was the song "Ol" Man River" sung by Joe. It was an all American show not afraid to show life in its harsh realities.

Revived innumerable times on the amateur stage our Society is pleased to present our own production this year, the 100th anniversary of the birth of Jerome Kern.


